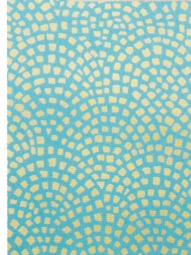

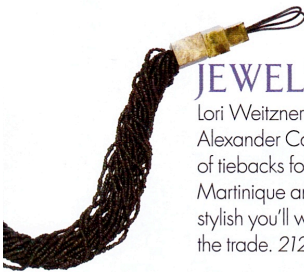


PAINT WITH A CAUSE
